Orchestra Performance Attendance Policy

Students are expected to attend all performances for their ensemble(s) and are expected to remain at the concert if other performing groups are playing. Ensemble performance is based on the balance and teamwork of the entire group. It changes the whole quality of performance when anyone is missing from the concert. It is the responsibility of each student and their parents to examine the schedule above closely and report any conflicts immediately. The GHS Music Department endeavors to give their concert dates as early as possible to establish "Prior Commitment". To request to be excused from a performance, students must bring in a note explaining the conflict written and signed by a parent or guardian as soon as the conflict i.e. family emergency, extraordinary unforeseen circumstance, arises. Excuses will be considered on a case-by-case basis. The following reasons for missing a performance will not be accepted: work, failure to find a ride, sports practice. In the event that a student has a conflict with a school sport game, both the coach and Mr. Boates should be notified as soon as possible so that a solution can be worked out. Students missing a performance will be asked to complete an alternate assignment. Failure to abide by this attendance policy will result in a lowered grade.

Rehearsal Participation

Students are required to bring their instrument along with a pencil to every class. Each student will be given a take-home folder for their music. You will be responsible for marking your own music in class to ensure productive practice at home.

Students cannot "sit out" without permission of the director. A student needing to sit out for more than one rehearsal for medical or other reasons must bring in a note from a parent. If an instrument is being repaired, please ask for a loaner when you drop off the instrument at the shop. We have a limited number of instruments at school that may only be used with permission from the director.

Cell Phone Use

There is a no tolerance policy for cell phone use in the class. Once class has begun, any student that uses a cell phone (for any purpose: checking time, texting, phone conversation...) will have their phone given to one of the deans.

Grading

- -Class participation
- -Performance Quizzes/Tests
- -Attitude and effort
- -Being prepared with materials (instrument, binder, pencil, any assigned homework)
- -Music preparation (at home practice)

Care of Instruments

Students are expected to keep their instrument clean and in good working condition at all times. <u>All</u> violinists and violists are required to keep, at least, one set of extra strings and good, working rosin in their case. Students should immediately report any instrument malfunctions to the director and make an appointment to have the instrument repaired promptly. Instrument cases should be clearly labeled with a name. Students must be respectful of instruments that belong to others. Simply, do not touch an instrument that does not belong to you without permission from your instructor. Behavior that might lead to the damage of an instrument will not be tolerated. Damaging an instrument intentionally will be grounds for removal from this course.

Instrument Storage

Students may leave their instruments in the music room storage areas in assigned lockers during the school day. Every attempt will be made to keep the storage room a secure area, however this room is not always locked, nor is it always supervised by an adult. thus every student should have a lock for their locker and the combination registered with Mr. Boates. Each student will have their own locker. They cannot be shared. Your locker is the safest place to put your instrument. Neither the high school nor the music department is responsible for instruments left anywhere else in the building.

Repertory Orchestra Concert Attire

Ladies: All black. Long black skirts or dress pants (emphasis on LONG), ¾ or long sleeve black blouse, black shoes. Dresses or skirts must fall well **BELOW THE KNEES**.

Men: Black dress pants, Black long sleeve button down collared shirt, dark tie, black shoes and black socks.

Private Lessons

Due to the number of students in the orchestra, individualized instruction is very difficult. Private lessons are a great way to get personal attention, especially for those students looking for a challenge. If you are interested in finding a private music teacher, please let Mr. Boates know. The music department maintains a list of private music teachers in the area. Limited scholarships are also available for those who may need financial assistance.

School Owned Instruments:

Students who are cellists and bassists will probably use school equipment each day instead of bringing their large instrument to and from school. The Guilford Music Department has a nominal charge of \$100 per year as a maintenance fee. This covers the **routine** maintenance of the instrument due to normal wear and tear. Students should expect the instrument to be in playable condition and are expected to treat the instruments with care.

Grade Leveling

Students may opt to take orchestra for level zero or level one credit. Level zero (grade does not impact cumulative GPA) will be automatically assigned to students who do not specifically request a level. To receive level one credit, the student must earn **50 points** through the following requirements **per quarter**.

- * Rehearse and Perform in an approved music ensemble outside of school (i.e. Shoreline Youth Symphony, Greater New Haven Youth Symphony, Concert Band, or Wind Ensemble, Neighborhood Music School Chamber Ensembles, church choir, Elm City Girls Choir, etc.) **20 pts. (Instructor verification required)**
- * Audition for CMEA Region Music Festival (Fall) or All-State Festival (spring) on applied instrument. **10 pts.**
- * CMEA Festival Participation 20 pts.
- * Weekly private lessons on applied instrument (minimum 12 lessons per semester) **20 pts.**
- * Participation in GHS musical (cast, pit or major crew assignment) 20 pts.
- *Assisting/mentoring with other GPS music teachers **15 pts.**
- * Member of GHS Music Department Stage Crew up to 10 pts. Per event
- * Serving in a leadership role in a music ensemble **10 pts.**
- * Performance in Extra Curricular Ensemble/Activity 20 pts.
- * Write detailed program notes for each of our three performances and submit them 3 weeks prior to each concert. **5 pts./piece**
- *Music Community Service; 2 hours = 5 pts. Up to 10 points total
